ASPARAGUS				
Mary Washington	30cm	45cm	Hardy, long lived & heavy producer. Strong 2 year old roots.	3
BLACKBERRY				
Black Satin	2m	2m	Thornless plant producing berries that ripen in July.	5
BLUEBERRIES				
	*Require acid soil. Must be cross pollinated by same bloom time different cultivar. High bush grow up to 3m, Low bush are less than 1m and have "Wild" flavor.			
Blue Crop (High bush)	1.75m	2m	Large, slightly tart. Mid-season with consistent yields and disease resistance.	4
Blue Ray (High bush)	1.75m	2m	Large dessert quality berries. Early to mid-season.	4
Bluejay	1.75m	2m	Early to mid-season berry with light blue, medium to large fruit. Mild flavor.	4
Duke	1.75m	1.5m	Self-pollinating	4
Jersey (High bush)	1.5m	2m	Heavy producing, late season variety. Very sweet, good for baking.	4
Nelson	1.5m	1m	Large berries, late season.	4
Northcountry (Low bush)	1m	1m	Sweet and mild, sky blue colour.	4
Northland (Low bush)	1.25m	2m	High sugar content, good for jams & baking. Early.	3
Patriot (High bush)	1.5m	1.2m	Very large, slightly flat fruit.	3
St. Cloud (Low bush)	1.25m	1.5m	Flavour and firmness great.	4
CURRANT				
Black Wellington	1.5m	1.5m	Soft medium to large black fruit. Abundance of fruit.	2
Red Lake	1.5m	1.5m	Large bright red berries. Good for jams/jellies.	5
White Pearl	1.5m	1.5m	White fruit, good for jam/jelly and wine.	3
ELDERBERRY				
Adam's	3m	3m	Large berries, heavy producer.	4
Korsor	3m	3m	Large, dark blue, flavourful and juicy berries. Ornamentally attractive flowers too.	4
GOOSEBERRY				
Pixwell	1.5m	1m	Pale green fruit, pink when ripe produced on old wood mid-summer. Used for jelly.	3

Canadice (Seedless)	2.5m	3m	Early red, eating.	4
Chardonnay	8m	2m	One of the hardiest white viniferas. Ripens mid-season. Wine.	5
Concord	10m	2m	Medium-large blue/black berry. Juicy & sweet. For eating, cooking/baking & juice. Ripen late October.	4
Himrod (Seedless)	8m	2m	Yellow gold, ripens mid/late September. Eating.	5
Interlaken (Seedless)	3m	2m	Golden yellow medium size fruit.	5
Merlot	7m	1.5m	Red, early, wine.	5
Niagara	1.75m	80cm	White, large and very sweet. Ripens late September. Eating & juice.	5
Riesling	6m	60cm	German cultivar used for wine. Medium sized, white fruit.	6
Sovereign Coronation (Seedless)	1.5m	1.25m	Blue ripens mid-September. Eating.	5
Suffolk (Seedless)	3m	5m	Red, eating.	4
Vanessa (Seedless)	1.5m	1.25m	Red, ripens mid-September, eating.	5
Wild Grape (<i>Vitis Riparia</i>)	12m	9m	Native vine useful for naturalizing. Produces small. Sweet fruit in summer. Vigorous and adaptable.	2
KIWI				
Hardy Issai	6m	3m	Unique, self-fertile variety that bears fruit after 1 year. Use as a vine, pick after frost.	6
RASPBERRY				
Black – Jewel	1.5m	1m	Heavy producer. Juicy, purple-black fruit. Delicious fresh or use for pies, jams, jellies, etc.	4
Fall Gold Everbearing	2m	2m	Large golden yellow, juicy sweet fruit.	5
Heritage Everbearing	2m	2m	Vigorous grower with medium sized red fruit.	4
Boyne	2m	2m	Medium sized fruit. Suitable for canning/freezing/dessert. Ripens July.	3
Latham	2m	2m	Very large berries, ripen over a long period.	3
Royalty – Purple	2m	2m	A cross between a purple and a red raspberry. Large fruit size. Outstanding for jams, jellies.	4
RHUBARB				
Canada Red	1m	1m	Bright red stocks. Suitable for colder areas.	3

German Wine	1m	1m	Large plump stalks are dark red & very sweet.	4
STRAWBERRY				
Everbearing	30cm	1m	Typically produce a spring and fall crop with little flowering or fruiting in the summer months.	4
Redcoat	30cm	1m	Berries are medium red and attractive. Berries maintain size well. Suitable for jams.	4
Seascape Everbearing	30cm	1m	Large fruit, high yield, good flavor.	3
Veestar	30cm	1m	An early, very productive variety. Good size and flavour. Attractive bright red; moderately firm.	4
OTHER				
Horse Radish	60cm	90cm	Full sun, grows 60cm high by 40cm wide, harvest whole plant after frost.	4
Jerusalem Artichoke	1.5m	2m	Flowers ornamental, use the tuber like roots like potatoes.	5
Josta Berry	1m	1m	Cross between black current and gooseberry. Ripens late July.	3
