Danica	1m	1m	Dwarf form. Dark green foliage is arranged in dense flattened sprays.	4
Golden Globe	1m	1m	Round cedar with bright golden foliage.	3
Little Giant Globe	1m	1m	Very tight compact plant. Great in small gardens.	3
Rheingold	1.2m	1m	Broadly globe to conical cedar. Gold new growth turns bronze.	3
Sunkist	2m	1m	Roughly globe-shaped shrub with golden foliage. Pyramidal with age.	2
Whipcord	1m	1m	Multi-branched shrub with long tendrils of foliage giving a very droopy mop effect. Nice glossy green summer colour and bronze cast in winter.	5
Woodward's Globe	1m	1m	Round compact plant, use for borders or foundation plantings.	3

Berckman's Gold	6m	3.5m	Compact & conical when young. New growth gold.	5
Black	5m	1.5m	Broader at base than 'Pyramidal.' Dark green foliage. Hardy.	3
Degroot's Spire	6m	1m	Narrow columnar form with dark green colour and coarse foliage. Slow growing.	3
Emerald	5m	1m	Bright green with densely packed foliage. Great for hedging or as a specimen.	4
Hedging Cedar	20m	3m	White cedar sold as a bare root plant. Perfect for hedging. Native.	2
Holmstrup	2.5m	1m	Compact upright with dark green foliage. Great as a small specimen.	3
Pyramidal	15m	1.2m	Compact, narrow, and erect. Can be used as an accent.	3
Spring Grove Western Red	7.6m	1.8m	Rich green foliage maintaining excellent winter colour with a tight pyramidal habit. Excellent deer resistance. Perfect for a large screen.	5
White	20m	2m	Fast growing, adaptable and very hardy. Excellent for hedging. Native.	2
Yellow Ribbon	3m	1m	Distinct narrow habit with sprays of yellow foliage.	3
